### Dutra starts driving piles for new floats; expect increased truck traffic with float arrivals

Pile driving for the new 12th Street Yacht Basin started in mid-December, and will continue through February.

This activity could generate some noise in the vicinity of the yacht basin but for the most part is a quiet operation.

Floats are being delivered by truck from Bellingham, and are assembled in the water. As the more than 200 floats are delivered, marina site users and tenants can expect an increase in truck traffic. All the floats should be on-site by the

### Big bird leaves the Port; crews working night shifts on rock work



American Construction has removed the yellow crane at the end of the North Marina site. It took approximately two weeks to deconstruct and load the crane on the barge. The crane will be reassembled and used in Mississippi.

American Construction is making significant progress on building the Port's new guest moorage facility.

In late December, American Construction removed their big yellow crane that had resided on the Port's waterfront, and has added a short night shift to ensure that the facility is built before the close of the in-water work window in February.

The night shift will operate from 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. until further notice. The crew will be using a crane to place armor rock along the shore to stabilize the bank. After the rock work is complete, the crews will be dredging the marina during the same night schedule.
